Being like Jesus

I listened to a webinar recently about becoming a missionary disciple. As a child my only concept of missionary was those people who travel to foreign lands to bring the Good News of Jesus' cross, death, resurrection, and Heaven when this earthly journey is done. Funny how time and experience changes things.

I have come to know that all of us need to be missionary disciples, beginning right where we are. How can we do that? Here are some thoughts from the webinar.

Are we busy? Make time to speak to, listen to and bless each other. Consider the ways God is working in your life and speak to each other of it. And while you at it, take it to the next step and do the same with God (prayer). He desires to bless us more than we know. But it can't happen fully without our co-operation. He desires to heal and fortify us through prayer, interaction with other members of the Church, and the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. Do it! Partake often! Be prepared for miracles! God will bless even the smallest efforts.

Do we need reminders? Pictures of Jesus, statuary, Christian books or magazines, even tuning into Christian radio are reminders of Somebody who gave up His life for you. Get some if you don't already have some. Need some? There is a collection of religious articles for free in the sacristy of St. Michael's. Partake! For children, get books about Jesus and read Bible stories to them. We need to walk with each other in whatever state we find each other.

Are we forgiving? Real love is selfless. (Christ went to the Cross for us.) Real love is sacrifice (Christ endured torture and death for us.) We need to forgive one another when we are not loving, understanding, supportive and encouraging. Christ asks us to spread the Good News of His love. It's likely that our actions speak louder than our words. Christ's last words on the cross? "Father forgive them for they know not what they do." (Luke: 23:34)

Do we know God? The New Testament of the Bible really helps here. Each of the Gospel writers tells Jesus' story, through different lenses. The Acts and the Letters tell stories of evangelization and encouragement. They are as relevant today as they were when written. And they are meant to help us lead joy-filled lives. Ongoing faith formation!

So, there is always more. (Just search the Internet!) Use these ideas as we march forward to Lent. We become that with which we fill ourselves. Will we let ourselves be filled by and for God? *Patty*

Word of Life

Reading I: Isaiah 58:7-10

True holiness is found in right relationships with one another.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Paul's second illustration of holiness: become transparent to let God's light shine through.

Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16

Salt is another image of holiness, and saltiness is given by God.

The Gospel images of salt and light capture the heart of discipleship. Common to every household, salt transforms the flattest food; light so common to our days, is precious and vital when darkness falls as it shows the way.

Adult question: What specific efforts do you take to maintain your light? Do you let your light dim?

Children: What can you do to bring the light of Jesus into the lives of your family, friends and people you meet?

Looking Ahead

Reading I: Sirach 15:15-20

Human beings have free will. The Law is a gift from God.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Happy are they that follow the Law of the Lord.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37 or 5:20-22a, 27-28, 33-34a, 37

The Law is God's gift of life. The holiness of Jesus' followers is a choice of life.

In the second reading God's law is contrasted to prevailing culture. Following Christ in radical obedience was the true wisdom of the Christian. The reward of radical obedience was beyond all human imagination.

Simple Ways to Share Our Faith

- ◆ When having friends over for dinner or when eating out in a restaurant, say Grace before eating. It will show them faith is important to you.
- ◆ When a friend comes to your house, do they see anything (like a Crucifix) that tells them you are a Catholic.
- ◆ Sharing faith begins by practicing our faith ourselves. Be sure and pray everyday.
- ◆ Help someone in need and if they ask you why you are willing to help, tell them "Because Jesus" loves them and so do you.
- ◆ Sometimes all we have to do to show God's Love is to listen.
- ◆ When you know a person in need, *tell them* you are praying for them.
- ◆ How have you been aware of God's help in your own life? Share the story with a friend or someone in need.



We rely on the presence of the Holy Spirit to enflame our hearts and open our minds as the beginning point for this encounter with God's love.

Are you interested in becoming a Deacon? There will be 2 information sessions 7pm Tue. Mar. 7, at Our Mother of Sorrows Church, 5000 Mt Read Blvd, Greece and 7pm Wed. Mar. 8, Church of the Transfiguration, 50 W Bloomfield Rd, Pittsford. An overview of the 5 year application, formation process and the time commitment involved as well as answering any questions. An eligible applicant for permanent deacon formation is a man of strong and active faith who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which he lives, works and worships. He must be at least 35 years of age and no more than 62 years of age at the time of ordination, in good health, emotionally mature and stable in his professional and personal relationships. Men may be single or married. Interested men and their wives are encouraged to attend.
