The Choice to Share the Good News

Over many months you have been hearing about evangelization and stewardship. The idea of being a disciple has been introduced as a choice that we can make. In support of this, the book, <u>Forming Intentional Disciples</u> has been offered for your reading. Some people have read it and others have chosen not to read it. That is a Choice.

This book speaks about our journey or process to know Jesus Christ, God and the Holy Spirit. We are all on our journey to know Jesus Christ and each of us is in our own place in that journey. Some are closer to discipleship than others. It is our journey and our choice to begin it or even to continue it. To begin that journey, we need to have some kind of bridge of trust to believe in Jesus Christ, to be a Christian and to be part of a church. That initial trust is followed by a curiosity about the Church and the Great Story of the life, teachings, crucifixion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ or the kerygma. This curiosity can grow to be a commitment to God and openly seeking to know and have a personal relationship with God. Jesus said to friends and acquaintances to follow him and they did. That too was a choice. They went out to spread the word of the Lord given to them by the teachings and actions of Jesus. The simple reality is that each one of us is expected to evangelize or share the Good News of the Lord also.

Those who have left the Church were on this same journey at some point and their progress interrupted from their being a member of the Catholic Church. All of those who have left the Church have a reason and often they want to tell their story. For them to return to the Catholic Church, they need to feel that they can tell their story without being judged and without those listening to the story becoming defensive. This may be a hard thing to do because we may be in a place in our own journey where we feel strongly in support of our faith and a similarly strong need to follow the spirit of the Commandments. We as Catholics have a responsibility to share our faith life and its importance to us to others when the situation seems right. Part of that evangelizing process is to listen to the story of others and invite them to be part of a faith that we find essential to our own happiness.

During Lent, the Evangelization Committee is planning to offer an opportunity for people who have left the Catholic Church to return in a welcoming process. Think of the people around you that have distanced themselves from their faith. Would you like to invite them to return to a welcome back? Do they want to tell their story and feel healed from the previous hurt? Give some thought to inviting others to this welcoming back process and think about where you are on your faith journey toward discipleship. Are you where you want to be and are you ready to make a greater commitment to follow Jesus Christ?
