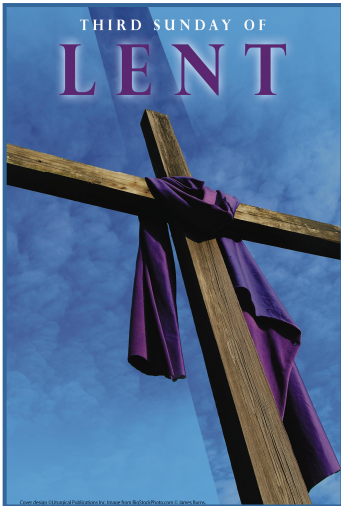

Third Sunday of Lent

In today's gospel, we have the familiar story of the Samaritan woman at the well. At noon, when the heat was the greatest and when she could avoid meeting other villagers, she finds Jesus resting while his disciples are looking for food. He asks her to draw him a drink of water. She is surprised that he is even speaking to her as she is accustomed to being looked down on by others.

We would do well to think about this woman and what this gospel tells us about our judging others. Her life style did not "fit in" with her fellow villagers. Having had five husbands made her a public eyesore, and yet Jesus ignores all of that. He asks her to give him a drink, and invites her to return to the village and return with her current husband to "drink of the living water."



It is evident that the younger generation of our time tends to be less judgmental than those of us who grew up in a black-vs-white society. They are more accepting of people who are different than themselves in nationality, in gender identity, in skin color. They were generally not among the unruly crowds of our recent political campaign. They have learned to live with differences. They have shown compassion for those arbitrarily excluded by our current administration.

Lent can be a good time for us to examine our ability to acknowledge the viewpoint and even the existence of others. It can be a time when we acknowledge our reactions to those who look, think, and act differently than we; when we take a second look at the things and people at whom we laugh or whom we criticize. To refuse to recognize someone else's rights is to live a very lonely life, cut off from the wisdom and compassion that that person might someday show us in return.

The woman identifies Jesus several times, each time with greater understanding. First, he was a Jewish man, then a prophet, and finally she makes a comment about the Messiah.

Adult question: When you are tempted to try to satisfy your "thirst for meaning" through some other means, what keeps you coming back to the living water of intimacy with Christ? Through what means do you experience Christ's power in your life?

Children: How do you experience Jesus helping and loving you?

Reading I: 1 Samuel 16: 1b, 6-7, 10-13a

David is anointed king of Israel.

Reading II: Ephesians 5: 8-14

You are people of the light.

Gospel: John 9: 1-41 or 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38

Jesus gives us sight.



The passage from Ephesians expands on the division between the sightless and the seeing. Those who believe in Jesus are children of light. With Christ they have been raised from the darkness of death and live in the light of Christ.
