In today's second reading Paul reminds the Romans of who they are at the deepest level of their being. He's addressing the question of what literally gives them life and therefore what motivates them to do what they do and be who they are. Paul's famous contrast is between flesh & spirit.

What Paul is talking about in his contrast of flesh and spirit is one's basic orientation in life. Being "in the flesh" is self-centered, subconsciously but irrevocably oriented to the processes of degeneration and death. People who live that approach to life "cannot please God" because they have opted out of the realm of God's influence; they have no room in their lives for anything bigger than their bellies. (See Philippians 3:19.) The religious way of "being in the flesh" may focus almost exclusively on obedience to the law and / or saving one's soul, an approach to life that is individualistic and ultimately egocentric.

Being "IN THE SPIRIT," on the other hand is first of all A GRACE, an undeserved but joyfully received GIFT OF GOD which flows over into a life of love of God and others. Being "in the spirit" is A RECIPROCAL RELATIONSHIP. Because the Spirit of God dwells in us, we actually live in God as well. Not only has God given us life, but we share, like Christ, in God's own life. We are not "of the flesh" — not because we reject anything of creaturely existence, but because we are oriented to much more. Being "in the spirit" is a way of life that helps us take our place in the midst of creation in the process of being "set free from slavery to corruption and share in the glorious freedom of the children of God" (Romans 8:21).

Paul's teaching about being "in the spirit" is profoundly humbling and intensely freeing. The greatest challenge of this reading is to believe that we who have been called to share in Christ's life have absolutely nothing to worry about. That is the freedom of the children of God.

We pray in our Stewardship Prayer before our weekend liturgies, "Renew my relationship with you...renew in me your spirit." Any relationship involves feelings: how do I feel about God; can I describe these feelings? Do I feel the Spirit of God in me? How do I let that Spirit guide me; how do I use the gifts the charisms of the Spirit in my service towards the parish?

As we approach the second aspect of Stewardship, the tithe of talent, let us reflect & be open to how we all are called, no matter our age, to be moved & motivated by the light of the spirit & not the darkness of self.

## Word of Life

### Reading I: Ezekiel 37: 12-14

*I will put my spirit in you.*

### Reading II: Romans 8: 8-11

*His Spirit will dwell in us and give us life.*

### Gospel: John 11: 3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

*Lazarus, come out!*



When you listened to the Gospel proclaimed, what drew your attention, caught your ear, stirred something? Was it Jesus delay in getting to Bethany and to his dear friends, after he had been called? Martha going out to meet him, or Mary being frozen in grief, unable to even go greet him? The drama of Lazarus coming bound from the tomb? That he was bound, and friends were needed to help unbind him? In rich stories like these three special Lenten Gospels (the Woman at the Well, the Man Born Blind, Lazarus), John places many jewels of insight for us to find as we listen, ponder, and turn the story over in our mind.

**For adult conversation & faith sharing:** Discuss with someone what struck you most in the readings today, and why you believe the Spirit may have directed your attention to that specific image, character or insight.

**Children:** Jesus loved Martha & Mary and Lazarus – that is why he went to the cemetery & prayed. Do you think Jesus is with us when someone we love dies?

#### Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11

*He humbled himself.*



#### The Passion: Matthew 26: 14-27 :66

On Passion Sunday, we hear the most precious test of our faith, the central mystery, our Lord's humility, compassion and sacrifice, which we know is the path to the resurrection new life and joy we celebrate throughout the Easter season. Since there will be so much to absorb, if there is ever a time to pull out *At Home with the Word*, or your Bible, and spend time with the readings before the weekend, this would be it! There is something in this Word of Life we will hear next week that is there just for you, this year. Why not go looking ahead of time? Think of Christmas as a child, looking around before the 25<sup>th</sup> for hidden presents. The difference? God isn't hiding that message just for you – God is urging you to start searching early!

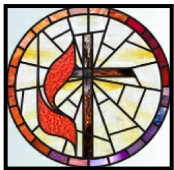
