Heather Lende is a reporter for **Chilkat Valley News** in Haines, Alaska (population: 2,000). Her beat: obituaries. Her 20 years of covering “last words and good lives” has been, to her surprise, a rewarding and illuminating experience. She writes in her book, **Find the Good: Unexpected Life Lessons from a Small-Town Obituary Writer**:

“Writing obituaries is my way of transcending bad news. It has taught me the value of intentionally trying to find the good in people and situations, and that practice — and I do believe that finding the good can be practiced — has made my life more meaningful.”

“After an elder who has been housebound and incapacitated by a stroke for twenty-five years dies, I find time to sit on the sofa and look through family albums with his widow and admire how handsome he was in his World War II uniform and how happy they both looked on that beach vacation the year before he was stricken. When twelve-year-old twins lose their mother to cancer, I will quote their father praising them and tell how he plans to take them on a family drive across the country to see their grandparents. And perhaps hardest of all, on the snowy winter morning when I meet with the parents and siblings of a young man who drank too much one night and shot himself, I write down how very much he had loved to swim in the lake in front of their summer cabin.”

“I understand why you may think that what I do is depressing, but compared to front-page news, most obituaries are downright inspirational. People lead all kinds of interesting and fulfilling lives, but they all end. My task is investigating the deeds, characteristics, occupations, and commitments, all that he or she made of their ‘one wild and precious life,’ as poet Mary Oliver has called it.”

Heather Lende’s “beat” is really “Emmaus”: pointing out the presence of God in hidden lives, revealing God’s love in the love that is experienced along the roads we all travel. We all have our Emmaus-like experiences of fear, confusion, dread, worry. But along the way, Christ makes himself known in our midst in the loving support of family and friends, of our community and parish. Christ travels with us on our own road to Emmaus; he is present in the broken bread of compassion we offer and receive from our fellow travelers. *Fr. Leo*

Looking Ahead

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles is a continuation from last Sunday of Peter's speech after Pentecost. Peter remains focused on what God has done in the Resurrection of Jesus: "God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." For Peter, the Crucifixion of Jesus did not bring about God's curse, as Jews believed about anyone who "hangs on a tree." Rather, the crucified Jesus brought the complete opposite: God's blessing, in the Resurrection.

"I give thanks to my God for you..."

As we continue to move through this Easter season it is important to know that the liturgies for this Easter do not just magically happen. It takes many hours of hard work by many gifted and generous people to create the environment and ceremony that we experience. Therefore, we echo the words of St. Paul to the Romans, "I give thanks to my God for you..." we also pray that God will bless you for your generous service to Him and to the church. If we mentioned each of you by name, it would take up much space, and being that we are all aging, someone is bound to be forgotten. However, you know who you are, and God knows who you are! Thank you for all you did to make this Easter so beautiful and inspiring, and for all you continue to do throughout the year as we allow God to use each of us to minister His love and grace through us. What a perfect way to renew your devotion to Mary.

St. Augustine's Opinion

Why do we encourage all who can to listen to the readings, rather than read along in the missalette? Here is what St. Augustine observed: "What comes through the eye goes to the mind. What comes through the ear goes to the heart." Here is a great strategy. Turn to the readings and read over them before Mass begins. That can get the ideas, images, and a sense of the reading into your mind. But then when the lector starts to proclaim the first reading, put the missalette down and just listen. See what how the Word can start to speak to your heart!

Singing the Psalms

You may have observed that sometimes we use a seasonal psalm, and not the one printed in the missalette. Or we use a different text or musical setting, even if it is not a seasonal psalm. Once again St. Augustine's observations help explain. In his day, during the week he would sometimes hear people in the parish singing the psalm sung in church during the week as they were going about their work. Sunday prayer spilling over into the week is much more likely when the psalm tune chosen has a strong, memorable melody, or when it is repeated throughout Lent, or the Easter season, or for a number of weeks. It also makes it possible to sing the refrain from memory in church.

National Day of Prayer...

Be a sign of hope and unity! Thursday, May 4th, 2017 is the National Day of Prayer. People of faith across the nation will join in intercessory prayer for our governmental leaders, local communities, and the most vulnerable among us.
