Speak Up For and With DREAMers, Children and Families

Throughout our diocese on Public Policy Weekend, we'll be signing petitions asking our Congressional representatives and the president to support a path to citizenship for the DREAMers, the young people brought to this country as children.

Recently, several immigration policies have been proposed by the White House and lawmakers; some combine support for the DREAMers with punitive and negative proposals that would end immigrant family reunification and hurt protections for unaccompanied immigrant minors, while adding billions more dollars to border security.

In response, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and our own Diocesan petition continue to insist that our elected officials **“reject any proposals that threaten family-based immigration or seek to undermine protections for unaccompanied children.”** We also insist that **“any border security measures included in such legislation are balanced, proportional, and humane.”**


