### God Calling?

My parents valued Catholic schooling enough to send me and my brothers to the parish's elementary school. There I learned not only religion and facts, but also how to take effective notes and how to study. When my public schooling began I breezed through that first year because everything being taught was stuff I had already learned. But there was something new – a guidance counselor. He called us to his office in small groups. He asked, “Who know what vocations are?” Stunned silence. I raised my hand. I said, “That is when someone prepares to be a priest or a nun.” I forget whether it produced laughter or looks, but this man affirmed what I said, adding that it is much more.

“Living out our baptismal calling is the vocation of every baptized person,” wrote Marian Bach, for Catechist's Journey, So, what is God calling each of us to be, to do?

Because we are created in the image and likeness of God, we are called to be more like Him. When we practice holiness, hospitality, patience, kindness, mercy, justice, forgiveness, compassion, charity, temperance, purity and self-sacrificing love, we are showing that we are God's children.

Being leads to doing. God gives each of us gifts and talents, desires, natural interests and skills. What motivates us to get out of bed each morning? What do we value? What gives us pleasure? What do we seek? Do we ask, “How can I use these to help the human family, my Church family?”

Psalm 95 is the standard opening for the Liturgy of the Hours. It is recited or chanted each morning in monasteries, churches, and homes throughout the world. It reminds us that all Creation is a gift from God and calls us to praise and worship. The Psalm's refrain challenges us each day, each "today," not to harden our hearts if we hear God's voice. That voice may come through events in our ordinary life, or through a unique situation, or even in the weekday scripture readings for daily Mass (listed in At Home with the Word). As well as reading these scriptures from your own Bible, you can read or hear them, along with a reflection, at the Web site of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, <http://www.usccb.org/video/reflections.shtml>. However the voice of God comes to you, reflect each night before sleep: "What did I hear? Did I harden or open my heart?"

### Living with Compassion
