It might be helpful to take a second look at today's Gospel reading. It is interesting that the people who knew Jesus, who had been listening to him teach in their synagogue every day, still could not figure him out. Yet he was evident to the "unclean spirit" who seemed to recognize him and who cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth?"

We would all do well to ask this question every morning as we face a new day. "What does Jesus have to do with my life?" Am I any different from the people around me who do not belong to any faith community? Do my co-workers, my friends, my family see anything different in me because of my commitment to Jesus? Are my actions, my life values, my opinions evidence of my belief and recognition of Jesus?

Recently, Cardinal Robert McElroy of San Diego, preached the following words:

"We must learn to be disrupters. We must disrupt those who would seek to send troops into our streets to deport the undocumented, to rip mothers and fathers from their families. We must disrupt those who portray refugees as enemies, rather than our brothers and sisters in terrible need. We must disrupt those who train us to see Muslim men and women and children as sources of fear rather than as children of God. We must disrupt those who seek to rob our medical care, especially from the poor. We must disrupt those who would take even food stamps and nutrition assistance from the mouths of children."

These are powerful words! We must pray for the courage to listen to them, and then to ask ourselves what our belief in Jesus really means. He was definitely a disrupter.

In the reading from the Old Testament, we meet Job—an innocent person who has suffered great misfortunes—suddenly losing family, property, and health. He struggles to understand why he has been so afflicted. When three hurricanes devastated the Caribbean Islands last fall, some people asked why God allowed this to happen. Others trusted that God was present even in the midst of such desperate suffering and responded with material and spiritual aid. How do we react in the face of such suffering? Pray! Pray daily for those who are suffering and those who are trying to help them. Pray for wisdom and insight for leaders, and for generosity from those who donate. Donate your time, talent, or treasure as your means allow.
