**Tell me how much you know Jesus, and I will tell you
what kind of Catholic you are**

Many times we have said we know Jesus because we go to Sunday Mass, know some prayers or go to the different activities of our parish. However, do we really know the Lord? In the gospel of St. Matthew, we can see how Jesus asked His disciples two very important questions: "Who do people say that I am?" (*Matthew 16:13*), and "who do you say that I am?" (*Matthew 16:15*). These questions are not only for His disciples, but also for each one of us. The Lord Jesus wants to know if we really know who He is. Now I wonder and ask you the same question, are we able to answer these questions? What have you and I heard about Jesus? What do you know about Jesus?

When Jesus asked these questions, Peter was the only one who said that Jesus is the Messiah because of the power of the Holy Spirit and time that Peter shared with Jesus, he was able to see that the Lord was really sent by our heavenly Father. Hence, Jesus trusted in Peter and named him the head of the Church. Therefore, the Church became the announcer of the Good News because she knows Jesus. The Church is mother and teacher as St. John XXII said in his encyclical "*Mater et Magistra*" (Mother and teacher).

Knowing Jesus has a consequence - Love. Jesus teaches us to love God and our neighbor, such as it is proclaimed in the gospel of this Sunday (*Mark 12:28B-34*). The prophet Jeremiah, for instance, tells us how he has experienced God's love: You seduced me, LORD, and I let myself be seduced; you were too strong for me, and you prevailed." (*Jeremiah 20:7*). God's love should be a love that it grows little by little at the same time we are knowing God unto it becomes in the most wonderful experience in our lives. However, this love implies sacrifices in our lives. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." (*Matthew 16:24-15*). Likewise, love demands we forgive each one of our brothers and sisters: "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." (*Matthew 18:22*). Forgiveness is essential in our lives.

Love is the great commandment of Jesus which all of us should know. When we love, we can do anything because everything is based on love. St. Augustine, father and doctor of the Church, understood this message from the Lord, and he expressed it in a simple sentence: "Love and do what you will." (*Confessions of St. Augustine, book 10, chapter 27*).

From the big commandment of Jesus, "Love God and our neighbor," we realize the true meaning of the message that Jesus taught us. If we understand this, so we can say openly we really know Jesus, we are Catholics because we not only talk about Jesus, but with our works we reflect Jesus in our lives. Therefore, let us love so you and I can say we are Christians, we are Catholics because we know Jesus.


