## The most important week of the year

When I was an altar server, I always was very excited for the celebration of the most important week for Christian people: Holy Week. I prepared myself for the different liturgical ceremonies, processions, acts of devotion, and so on, which told me about the most beautiful gifts given to us by God through the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. All the celebrations were awesome, especially Palm Sunday, the Washing of the Feet, The Adoration of the Cross, and of course the celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord.

**Palm Sunday:** Christians not only remember the triumphal entrance of the Lord into Jerusalem, riding a donkey, and people greeting the Lord saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord. Peace in heaven and glory in the highest." (Luke 19:38), but also is the triumphal entrance of Jesus into our towns, our families, and our hearts. All people in all the churches around the world praise Jesus because we realize that He is the King of kings and came to save all of us through His sacrifice on the Cross. For this reason, two gospels are proclaimed in this celebration: first, it is proclaimed the gospel of the triumphal entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem (Luke 19:28-40), and second it is proclaimed the Passion of the Lord (Luke 22:14—23:56). By the way, this is the only liturgical celebration that two gospels are proclaimed.

**Holy Thursday:** Christians around the world remembers three beautiful actions of the Lord in this day. First, The Lord Jesus instituted the Eucharist. Jesus wanted to be with us in the bread and wine. Jesus is present in the Eucharist, and each time that we celebrate a Eucharist, we are not only remembering what Jesus did over two thousands ago with His disciples, but we are also living this beautiful moment. Second, Jesus instituted the Priesthood. When the Lord celebrated His Last Supper, He gave the apostles the authority to consecrate the bread and wine to become the body and blood of the Lord by the power of the Holy Spirit. This is why the priest needs to serve his neighbor as Jesus did. One example of this is the washing of the feet, because the Lord invited His apostles to do the same. Do not forget to pray for priests not only on Holy Thursday, but always. And third, Jesus gave us a new commandment: the commandment of Love. We should love God and our neighbors. If we love, we serve the others because we find the presence of the Lord in our neighbors.

**Good Friday:** This day we celebrated the sacrifice that the Lord Jesus made for us on the Cross. "We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You. Because, by Your holy cross, You have redeemed the world." These are the words we say when we pray the Stations of the Cross. Jesus died on the Cross because He loves us very much. His death is not the end, but the beginning of something beautiful that the Lord God has prepared for all of us. We praise the Holy Cross because we do not see the Cross as an instrument of death, but an instrument of life. The death of Jesus on the Cross is the most beautiful proof of Jesus' love. We should pray and say thanks to the Lord because we are saved through this beautiful sacrifice.

**Easter Vigil:** This is the most important ceremony for the Christians, because Our Lord Jesus Christ rose from the death. He conquered death, and gave us hope that one day we will be with Him in the house of our Heavenly Father.

During this ceremony, the fire is blessed and the Pascal Candle is lit as a visible sign of the Resurrection of the Lord. The Exsultet is chanted, and this chant tells us the victory of Jesus over death. The readings, which are seven, are proclaimed and tell us the history of salvation; however, for pastoral reasons, the parish can proclaim only four readings. The church is dark, but at the moment to sing Gloria, the lights turn on as a visible sign of the resurrection of the Lord. After the homily, RCIA people receive their sacraments (baptism, confirmation, and first communion), and the rest of the Eucharist continues as always, but always reminding the joy for the resurrection of the Lord.

My brothers and sisters. Let us go to celebrate these sacred mysteries in company of all the community, and let us say to God "thanks" for giving His only begotten Son to redeem us. Let us participate with joy and invite our family, relatives, friends, coworkers, and everybody around us to celebrate with the same joy these sacred mysteries.
