What do we do between the ups and downs of the Ascension and Pentecost?

Jesus said to his disciples: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." (Luke 24:44-49)

After the Ascension of Jesus the apostles are told to stay in the city and wait. We know they went to the upper room where they celebrated the Passover with Jesus. And so they waited. We could say this is a **Holy Waiting** commanded by The Son of Man. Christ puts the waiting before the receiving for definite reasons. He wants time to minister to us and to prepare for what is to come. It is difficult to wait whether it's at the DMV, the Dr's Office or even in traffic. Nobody today likes to wait. We live in a society of instant satisfaction, instant fulfillment, and even needing instant approval. Perhaps we can learn from the disciples how to spend time waiting so it's beneficial for us.

"Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. When they entered the city they went to the upper room where they were staying..." (Acts 1:12-13a)

The disciples found a waiting room for recollection and as a safe haven. They recalled the shared Passover meal, the foot washing, first communion, and the Garden experience. We also can find places for remembrance such as a candle in a quiet corner, on the beach at the ocean, or in the park on a picnic. Some place where we can find time to pause, breathe, experience and remember.

"...Peter, and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these devoted themselves with on accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers." (Acts 13b-14)

Waiting can be a lonely time and one of the best ways to wait is with someone else. Being in community helps jog our memories and builds us up when we're too tired of waiting. We can more easily see the end as we wait while looking forward with another.

"My brothers, the scripture had to be fulfilled which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand through the mouth of David, concerning Judas, who was the guide for those who arrested Jesus. He was numbered among us and was allotted a share in this ministry. ... Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection." (Acts 1:16-17, 21-22).

The Apostles were left empty by more than just the defeat of Jesus. Their numbers were reduced from 12 to 11 with the failure of Judas. Where Judas had been, a gap existed that was a reminder of the wound and betrayal of a man they loved and trusted. During their waiting they found someone to take Judas' place, to restore and heal what was broken. When we wait we have lots of time to reflect and often find ourselves thinking about people that hurt us, experiences that left deep wounds, or maybe just a feeling of emptiness. God asks us to wait so he can heal us. He brings us to a much greater place than we knew before and fills us with trust and friendship. He brings us into a loving community of believers where we can live in security, surround ourselves with beauty and sustain fresh memories. Peace be with you all as we look ahead to Pentecost.

Tithing Rooted in Religion

Tithing is definitely rooted in our relationship to God & should not be considered as a fund-raising program. A person who considers this approach recognizes that the source of their total being, their life, their freedom, their capacity to love, their abilities all come from God. If one develops these gifts fully, one will want to share them with others, & with those who, through circumstances, have need of help.

The only motive that will enable a person to accomplish this is one's honest evaluation of oneself with God & accepting God's gifts as something to be shared.

We find tithing deeply rooted in the ancient Jewish religion. It certainly recognized the fact for the Jewish religion to develop one must give of that which one possesses. We are all familiar that 10% was indicated. A number of persons have to evaluate their personal obligations & must adjust.
