A minister was leading a Bible study group in a women's prison. At one point, a young indigenous woman spoke up. She leaned forward with tears in her eyes and said: "Can I ask a question? I don't know how to say it, but I really wanna know. How do I get 'unstuck'? I'm so tired of making the same mistakes, going back to the same people and problems . . . I don't know . . . I guess I just wanna know how to get 'unstuck.'"

Her words dripped with urgency, longing, dread and pain.

The minister and volunteers leading the group bumbled toward a response, acknowledging how hard it was to break out of patterns of addiction and abuse and dysfunctional relationships and poverty, but that God is "present in the journey."

The minister leading the group later reflected:

"I suspect that even as I grieved for the specific ways in which this young woman was stuck, I was recognizing myself and many of my peers in her words. I suspect we all get to a certain point in life where the word stuck can easily creep into our vocabulary. Passion for the job seems more elusive, the sizzle of a marriage wanes, faith seems more remote and inaccessible. In whatever domain of life, we settle into familiar and predictable rhythms. We realize that there are things about our lives, our communities, our world that are rather hard to change . . . I thought of all these things as I drove home from the jail. I thought about how it's not just individuals who get stuck, but relationships, businesses, churches, institutions, even cultures. And I prayed. For all who feel stuck and for all the ways in which we need to get unstuck to live the lives we were created for."

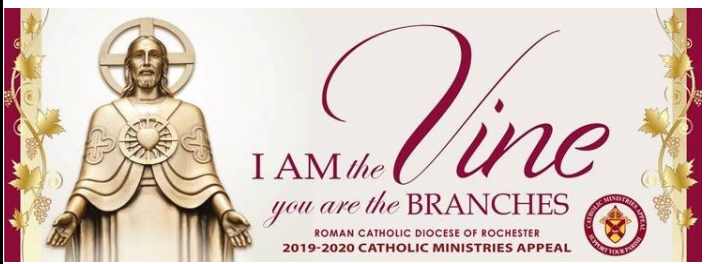

LOL's Social Ministry Team asks you to remember and support those in our surrounding community and their daily needs.

Cleaning out closets? remember the Once Again shop in Penn Yan and The Friendship House and Naples' Open Closet. A special request has been made of the St. Patrick's family to assist with laundry expenses for subsidized housing residents in the area. Tide laundry pods will help those with few resources care for what they own.

How can the spread of the influenza virus be prevented? The single best way to prevent the flu is to get vaccinated each fall. It is also helpful to avoid close contact with people who are sick.

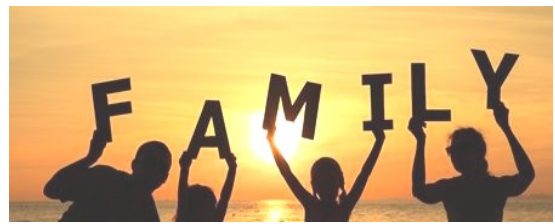
- ◆ If you are sick, do not worsen your illness by trying to get to church, and do not put others at risk of catching your illness. It is not sinful to miss Mass if you are sick; it is an act of charity. If your children are sick, keep them home from Mass, religious education, or youth ministry meetings. If you are seriously ill, the Church wants to celebrate with you the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. You can arrange for this by contacting your parish office.
- ◆ Don't cough or sneeze into your hands. Use a tissue to cover your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze, then throw it away. If you don't have a tissue handy, do what school children are taught to do: cough or sneeze into your shirt sleeve and avoid touching the area of fabric you coughed into.
- ◆ Wash your hands often. Soap, water, and a good scrubbing are the best defense against the cold and flu viruses. Scrub your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If you are not near soap and water, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer or disposable hand wipe. Keep a small bottle or packet in your purse or pocket.
- ◆ Avoid shaking hands with others before, during, and after Mass if you are sick or have been in direct contact with someone who is sick. At the Sign of Peace, offer a smile or a wave or a simple bow of the head to those around you. If you have come in direct contact with someone who has been sneezing or coughing, avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with your hands until you can wash them, since germs can spread when we touch our eyes, nose, or mouth. Respect should be given to individuals who refrain from sharing a handshake at the Sign of Peace. This is at the discretion of each individual person.
- ◆ Refrain from receiving Communion on the tongue or from the Cup if you are sick. The sign of Communion is more complete when receiving under both kinds, but receiving both is not required.
