

Reading I: Isaiah 22: 19-23

Thus says the LORD to Shebna, master of the palace: "I will thrust you from your office and pull you down from your station. On that day I will summon my servant Eliakim, son of Hilkiyah; I will clothe him with your robe, and gird him with your sash, and give over to him your authority.

He shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and to the house of Judah. I will place the key of the House of David on Eliakim's shoulder; when he opens, no one shall shut, when he shuts, no one shall open. I will fix him like a peg in a sure spot, to be a place of honor for his family."

Reading II: Romans 11: 33-36

Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearchable his ways!

For who has known the mind of the Lord or who has been his counselor?

Or who has given the Lord anything that he may be repaid?

For from him and through him and for him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen.

Gospel: Matthew 16: 13-20

Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?"

They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets."

He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"

Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

Then he strictly ordered his disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ.

◆ **Adult Faith Sharing** - In this reading, the powerful symbol of authority—keys—are entrusted to Peter, who is the "rock" upon which the Church will be built. Peter is, in many ways, among the most human and frail figures in the Gospel accounts, and yet he is also among the most faithful. What role does Peter play? Who are the successors of Peter and the Apostles?

◆ **Family Faith** - This week, we have readings that speak of "keys." What do keys do? Who has keys? Are there people who have special kinds of keys? Have you ever heard of someone getting an honorary key to a city? Find examples of this. What would it mean to be given the keys to the Kingdom?

◆ **Christian Initiate** - The psalms are a rich treasure of prayer, expressing every sort of human response to life. Do you notice that often the refrain of the Responsorial Psalm we sing on Sunday will float into your mind during the week? It's a good way to carry the prayer with you throughout your days. Pray today's psalm each day during the week and memorize the refrain so that you can repeat it throughout each day.

August 22, is the **Feast of the Queenship of Mary**. Let's place ourselves, our families and our country, intently and with confidence, under the Queenship of our mother Mary. It may not sound urgent and it may not even be obvious, but there is an agenda to weaken the Church socially, politically and culturally. This is the time for vigilance, and for taking a stand, following our Master's advice to be innocent as doves, but also wise as serpents. Let's not be caught off-guard or allow ourselves to be overtaken by events and circumstances because of our complacency or our desire for self-preservation.

A prayer for humility: "God, I am far too often influenced by what others think of me. I am always pretending to be either richer or smarter or nicer than I really am. Please prevent me from trying to attract attention. Don't let me gloat over praise on one hand or be discouraged by criticism on the other. Neither let me waste time weaving imaginary situations in which the most heroic, charming, witty person present is I. Show me how to be humble of heart like you." Lord, remind me that life is not so much about image, or being **impressive**, but being real and being **expressive**. Amen.
