This weekend's readings highlight God's presence.

Elijah waited for the Lord, but first had to endure the wind, rain, an earthquake and fire. God's voice wasn't in any of those big occurrences. Elijah heard God in the whisper that came after.

In the Gospel, again there was strong wind (The Holy Spirit), which preceded Jesus' coming to the disciples on the water. Peter had the courage to say to Jesus that if you are really walking on water and not a ghost, "command that I come to you on the water."

Jesus said, "Come." Today Jesus is still calling us to "Come." So, how shall we come?

First, remember that God's call is a vocation. He is calling us to be His disciples and to use the gifts and talents He has bestowed upon us. Single, married, parent, childless, liturgical minister, architect, cleaner, friend, missionary... It doesn't matter who or where you are, God wants us to be His disciples "announcing The Good News by the way we live our lives." Second, Jesus is waiting for us in The Eucharist. The Mass is the memorial of His life, death and resurrection. By the action of The Holy Spirit, ordinary bread and wine, and we, are changed. Jesus humbles Himself to be alive in us when we receive The Eucharist. He wants to strengthen us for the joys and troubles of life in this existence and to show others what a difference a life in Christ makes.

Not comfortable about returning to Mass in person? Take in Mass through social media ending with the Act of Spiritual Communion. (We are also called to dialog with God (aka prayer).) Eucharistic Adoration is available online. Finally, let us remember the words of Scripture:

"Come to me all who labor and are heavy burdened and I will give you rest."

(Matt. 11:28-30)

"Let all who have nothing, let them come to the Lord." (Isaiah 55:1)

Come to the water of Baptism in which our stain of original sin is replaced with the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, adoption into God's chosen.

How will we come when we hear God's call?

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time - August 9, 2020

Reading I: I Kings 19:9a, 11-13a

At the mountain of God, Horeb, Elijah came to a cave where he took shelter. Then the LORD said to him, "Go outside and stand on the mountain before the LORD; the LORD will be passing by." A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountains and crushing rocks before the LORD - but the LORD was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake - but the LORD was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake there was fire - but the LORD was not in the fire. After the fire there was a tiny whispering sound. When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 85:9, 10, 11-12, 13-14

Reading II: Romans 9:1-5

Brothers and sisters: I speak the truth in Christ, I do not lie; my conscience joins with the Holy Spirit in bearing me witness that I have great sorrow and constant anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people, my kindred according to the flesh. They are Israelites; theirs the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; theirs the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, is the Christ, who is over all, God blessed forever. Amen.

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear.

At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God."

◆ Adult Faith Sharing - ◆ In the psalm, we entreat God to let us see his kindness. Are you aware of God's kindness in your life? Where do you see it? What might you do to become more aware of it?

Christian Initiate ◆ The disciples are being tossed at sea, and Jesus goes to them in the storm. Peter reaches out to him in faith, but then he starts to drown. What distracts his attention away from the Teacher? What happens to you when your faith wavers? What is the corrective? Most of us have someone very special who loves us very much, like a parent or grandparent. Can you imagine that they could ever stop loving you? Paul tells us that there is absolutely nothing that will keep Christ from loving us. Do you believe this? Or do you think it's too good to be true?! Talk together about God's limitless love.



Congratulations to Our Lady of the Lakes member Deacon Roger Loucks!

Our own **Roger Loucks** is one of five local Catholic men scheduled to be ordained. Each has celebrated milestones along the paths to their respective vocations.

The vocational journey of each man has been unique. But all five roads will converge at Rochester's Sacred Heart Cathedral Aug. 15, when Bishop Salvatore R. Matano is scheduled to ordain three of the men to the permanent diaconate and two as transitional deacons on their way to the priesthood.



A physics professor at [Alfred University](#) in Allegany County, **Roger Loucks** said there wasn't one specific moment when he suddenly realized he was being called to pursue a vocation as a permanent deacon.

"My interest in the diaconate was quite slow. ... Bit by bit I started feeling called to the diaconate," said Loucks, 54.

He grew up in Avoca, Steuben County, and after high school studied physics and math at [Houghton College](#) in Allegany County. After graduating from Houghton, Loucks went to graduate school at the [University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign](#), where he studied theoretical nuclear physics and earned his doctorate in physics.

He converted to Catholicism in 1996, while in Illinois. He taught at [Creighton University](#), a Jesuit university in Omaha, Neb., for three years before returning to New York in 2002 to teach at Alfred University.

Loucks, his wife, Catherine, and their daughter, Sarah, belong to [Our Lady of the Lakes Catholic Community](#), which has worship sites in Prattsburgh, Penn Yan and Naples. He has served in a number of roles in the parish, including catechist, lector, extraordinary minister of holy Communion and temporary religious-education director, and said all of those experiences helped him discern his vocation as a deacon.
