Christmas is over, but we continue the celebration

Christmas is over... we won't have the Christmas tree at home, or eat Christmas cookies, or exchange presents. No more Christmas carols or expecting for the coming of Santa. However, although Christmas is over, the joy to have the Lord with us should remain in our hearts. This is precisely the meaning of Ordinary Time. Some people believe that Ordinary Time means "boring time;" however, its meaning is very different. "Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ" (<https://www.learnreligions.com/ordinary-time-in-the-catholic-church-542442>). Moreover, "Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ" (<https://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/liturgical-year-and-calendar/ordinary-time>).

Christ is among us. He is the Emmanuel who is always showing us the merciful Father. We need to be closer to Him, allowing us during the different seasons of the liturgical year to experience the love of God. If we have a special connection with God through the sacraments, different prayers, and our service to our brothers and sisters, we are really letting Jesus touch our hearts and have an ordinary life; that means, to have a life according to natural order created by God.

My brothers and sisters let us celebrate always that the Lord Jesus is with us always, regardless the liturgical season. God is with us 365 days at year, so let us rejoice because the Emmanuel is here always to lead each one of us to the house of Our Heavenly Father.

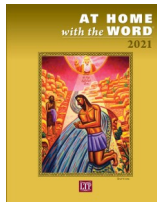

In light of a recent [U.S. Supreme Court](#) decision, the [Diocese of Rochester](#) has issued updated guidelines to parishes regarding seating restrictions for Masses at its worship sites.

According to guidelines - churches in red zones - as designated by NY state officials - may hold liturgies with congregations totaling no more than 25 percent of the churches' maximum head-count capacities. Attendance at liturgies celebrated in orange zones is capped at 33 percent capacity, and the limit for worship sites in yellow zones or undesignated (no zone) areas is 50 percent.

The diocesan statement noted that these limits are the result of "consultation with the NY State Catholic Conference and our legal counsel."

The diocesan statement added that "it is absolutely vital that our parishes continue all efforts associated with cleaning of public spaces, hygiene, wearing of masks, social distancing, and the diocesan liturgical guidelines which still remain in effect."

From the Grapevine Express:

Covid-19 Vaccine Information for Senior Medicare patrol:

We know that Covid-19 vaccine fraud will move very quickly, very soon, and will take many forms. Scammers rapidly alter their tactics and adapt their schemes to the changing landscape, and we anticipate that they will leverage the pending Covid-19 vaccine to prey on unsuspecting beneficiaries. At this point, it is essential that we alert the public of likely schemes and provide them with information on how they can protect themselves.



- ◆ You likely will not need to pay anything out of pocket to get the vaccine during this public health emergency.
- ◆ You cannot pay to put your name on a list to get the vaccine.
- ◆ No one from Medicare or the Health Department will contact you.
- ◆ No one from a vaccine distribution site or health care payer, like a private insurance company, will call you asking for your Social Security number or your credit card or bank account information to sign you up to get the vaccine.

Beware of providers offering other products, treatments, or medicines to prevent the virus. Check with your local health care provider before paying for or receiving any Covid-19 related treatment.

If you get a call, text, email - or even someone knocking on your door - claiming that they can get you early access to the vaccine, STOP!!!

That is a scam.
