If there is any benefit from this pandemic, it may be a greater appreciation for all those things that we had just assumed would always be there. For example, consider Lent. Yes, Lent. Although Lent is a season of penance, it is also a season where we gather together in someone's house for Lenten small group discussions, which are often followed by an evening cup of coffee and dessert. It is also the season where we gather together at the different worship sites throughout our parish for fellowship, soup suppers, and Stations of the Cross on cold Friday evenings. When you start looking at this aspect of Lent, it hardly seems like penance. But, sadly, COVID, for the moment at least, has taken these activities away.

Zoom Meeting



Fortunately, modern technology gives us an option, which is certainly less than ideal, but nonetheless a reasonable substitute for our in person Lenten small group meetings. You have probably already guessed that I'm eluding to using ZOOM as a substitute for our in-person Lenten meeting. Since I teach, I have used ZOOM with my students since last March, and I can honestly say that the technology is reliable and easy to use. So, now the only question is how to proceed?

Luckily, Fr. Leo has found a 7 week Lenten program from Boston College called *Faith Feeds*. The seven topics for the program are quite appropriately: baptism, care for the poor, forgiveness, hope, prayer, suffering, and gratitude. Fr. Leo has asked deacon Tim and me to lead two of the ZOOM Lenten small groups. There will be other ZOOM small groups as well. So, if you are interested in joining my ZOOM small group Lenten please e-mail me at loucks@alfred.edu, and I will send you, via e-mail, the program for the first week's discussion. I'm planning on our meeting lasting about an hour. When you e-mail me, please let me know which night and time you would prefer. Right now, I'm thinking Wednesday evening starting around 6:30pm, BUT this may change depending on everyone's schedule.



Even if you are unable to attend my small group, please consider joining one of the other small groups. COVID has separated us from one another, but even though we can't meet in person, we can at least meet via ZOOM and see and hear one another during one of the most important seasons in the liturgical year.



Advocacy Issue: Funding for NOURISH NEW YORK initiative

NOURISH NEW YORK is a New York State initiative that provides funding to Food Banks to purchase New York State-produced farm products. This accomplishes two goals: it offers market support to farmers, the fishing community, and food processors who have been impacted by the economic effects of the pandemic, while getting high-quality food to individuals and families across the state who are struggling to put food on their tables. The initiative provided \$35 million in funding from May 1 to December 31, 2020. 4,152 farms have provided over 17 million pounds of high-quality New York-produced food to New Yorkers in need.
