This weekend's readings encourage us to consider the sins of all. "Repent and believe in the Good News!"

It took a lot of courage (and a conversion of heart) for Jonah to go to Nineveh. (If you recall, Jonah was the prophet that doubted himself and his mission. Three days in the belly of a whale brought about that conversion. Read it for yourself in the first two chapters of this book in your Bible.)

We also have the mission to "Go and announce

the Good News by how you live your lives." (Mass dismissal) Wow! When others see us, will they know by our actions and words that we are Catholic Christians? Have we had the conversion experiences that let us know that with God all things are possible? (Maybe not yet? "Take it to the Lord in prayer," as the song goes.)

Pray for an increase in faith. Like the first Apostles, they responded to Jesus invitation to "Come and see." with a leap of faith, changing their lives as fishermen to become "fishers of men."

It takes faith to believe. With the power of the Holy Spirit, given to us in Baptism and unleashed in us at Confirmation, and the grace of the Sacraments we can forge ahead into uneasy situations knowing that God's plan is unfolding, if we are following His ways.

There are some key events this week which call us to "repent, believe and share God's love."

If you are participating in the 9 Days for Life, you are already on your way to repent for the sins of our nation. The passage of Roe v. Wade into law 48 years ago (legal through all 9 months!) means that 62.5 million aborted lives have been lost in the US. (roughly the size of the population of Italy.) (The number world-wide is 1.6 billion.) What contributions could those lives have made? (Happily, the number of abortions per year in the US has been decreasing, but 4 in 10 are still aborted, according to Wikipedia.) It takes courage and action to "Stand Out for Life" and support our local pregnancy care centers.

Tomorrow there will be a book launch and webinar about "Caring for our Common Home" (Laudato Si). Get details from our Facebook page or the 1/15 issue of "Salt & Light" (use the link from our website).

Thursday into Friday is the national prayer vigil to overturn abortion and hold a greater respect for life. PRAY TO PROTECT HUMAN LIFE!




Nine Days for Life is coming! Will you be one of the thousands of Catholics nationwide praying the annual 9 Days for Life novena, January 21-29? Sign up at 9daysforlife.com.

In light of a recent [U.S. Supreme Court](#) decision, the [Diocese of Rochester](#) has issued updated guidelines to parishes regarding seating restrictions for Masses at its worship sites.

According to guidelines - churches in red zones - as designated by NY state officials - may hold liturgies with congregations totaling no more than 25 percent of the churches' maximum head-count capacities. Attendance at liturgies celebrated in orange zones is capped at 33 percent capacity, and the limit for worship sites in yellow zones or undesignated (no zone) areas is 50 percent.

The diocesan statement noted that these limits are the result of "consultation with the NY State Catholic Conference and our legal counsel."

The diocesan statement added that "it is absolutely vital that our parishes continue all efforts associated with cleaning of public spaces, hygiene, wearing of masks, social distancing, and the diocesan liturgical guidelines which still remain in effect."

If you have family or friends who are not attending Mass due to COVID concerns please take a rice bowl and drop it off to them. Our parish has been using an **Online Giving system** that is strengthening stewardship as well as making it easier for members to support our parish. Ignore any vaccine offers that say different, or ask for personal or financial information.
