It was last year at this time, that the first cases of covid-19 began to manifest itself. The Rite of Election for our RCIA catechumens was held in Corning & the bishop was practicing social distancing. Since that time, we all have been called on to practice & implement new lifestyles.

In a few weeks we begin the **Season of Lent on Wednesday February 17<sup>th</sup>**. As it stands now there will be Ash Wednesday & Lenten programs but they will be different.

**ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICES** (Mass & distribution of ashes):

St. Michael's: 8 am; Noon; 7 pm

St. Januarius: 8 am; Ecumenical Service 7 pm

How ashes will be distributed: After the homily the ashes will be blessed; the phrase "Repent & believe in the Gospel OR You are dust..." will be said ONCE. Remaining in your pews ashes will be sprinkled on top of your head.

This is not an innovation but is in accord with the ancient practice of the Church, as is the practice in parts of Europe & Asia. This remains the practice at the Vatican, recalling the biblical method of putting on sackcloth & ashes as a sign of penance: "Now on the twenty-fourth day of this month the people of Israel were assembled with fasting & in sackcloth, & with earth upon their heads." (Nehemiah 9:1)."

**BLACK BOOKS**: With daily prayers & Meditations will be distributed the weekend before (Feb.13<sup>TH</sup> & 14<sup>TH</sup>) & on Ash Wednesday.

**CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES RICE BOWLS**: Will be available on the weekend before & on Ash Wednesday. Return Palm - Easter Sundays.

**VIRTUAL STATIONS OF THE CROSS**: will be on a day & time to be determined.

**SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**: Saturdays from 4 – 4:30 pm at St. Michael's Chapel (Enter through parking lot door) or by appointment.

**FAITH FEEDS** will be the Lenten Program offered. It is from the Church in the E 21<sup>ST</sup> Century Center (C21) located at Boston College. Topics cover Gratitude; Baptism; Suffering; Prayer. The sessions can be done over 1-2 weeks.

If you want to form your own small groups please let Fr. Leo know & the material will be provided.

Fr. Leo will be doing a Zoom Session (limited to 10 people) on Tuesdays beginning Feb. 23rd at noon.

You need to call the Parish Office to register.

Deacon Roger & Deacon Tim will also be conducting Zoom Sessions - more information to follow in the coming weeks.

Fr. Jorge will begin a session beginning the week of March 8th.

Other information will be coming in the next couple weeks.



**Funding for NOURISH NEW YORK initiative**  
**NOURISH NEW YORK** is a New York State initiative that provides funding to Food Banks to purchase New York State-produced farm products. This accomplishes two goals: it offers market support to farmers, the fishing community, and food processors who have been impacted by the economic effects of the pandemic, while getting high-quality food to individuals and families across the state through the regional Food Banks to local church-based and community food pantries. The initiative provided \$35 million in funding from May 1 to December 31, 2020. 4,152 farms have provided over 17million pounds of high-quality New York-produced food to New Yorkers in-need.
