Tangible Resurrection

Kind words are OK — but when you're at a loss as to what to do or how to get beyond your grief, a cup of coffee with someone who understands can be an experience of resurrection.

The course begins with a detailed syllabus distributed by the professor. The syllabus outlines the readings and texts, the required papers and projects, the schedule of quizzes and exams. The syllabus includes the learning goals for the course and additional resources for students. Students are excited about the possibilities. But the course is not the syllabus: the course is the learning and inquiry that takes place in the classroom or seminar room.

He loves reading about fishing. She's hooked on HG-TV. Both happily lose themselves in the ideas and suggestions, the stories and experiences recounted. He can't wait to try that fly on his favorite trout stream; that color scheme and tile would look great in her kitchen. But they're only wishes and hopes until he wades into the current some spring morning, until she pries open a can of paint and grout and goes to work.

Many have "mastered" Zoom and Skype this past year; we've come to live for those online chats and visits with loved ones. We've learned to teach, to interview, to conduct business with students and clients and coworkers in living rooms all over the world — but an image on a screen is no substitute for a face-to-face exchange, the most effective learning dynamic is experienced in the community created in the classroom, love is most happily expressed in a grandchild's hug.

In today's Gospel, the disciples tell Thomas they have seen Jesus. Thomas replies that "unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." In countless sermons over the centuries on the Second Sunday of Easter, Thomas has been criticized for his "doubt" in the resurrection — but Thomas is no different than we are: Thomas wants something he can touch; he wants a tangible sign of Jesus' resurrection. After the horrific week since Jesus' crucifixion, he wants more than a metaphor. Thomas wants real life, life perfected and re-created by God. Jesus acquiesces. The Crucified Jesus lives again — in us. Our compassionate presence to one another, our embrace of one another in peace and respect, our commitment to the Gospel work of reconciliation and justice are all tangible signs of Jesus' resurrection. This Easter season, may we realize the many ways we can "touch" and make real the Risen One in our midst.

“Lord, when did we see You... in prison?” Matthew 25:39

“Please, don't give up on them.”- A former inmate speaking to a jail ministry on behalf of her incarcerated friends. We have many times heard Jesus speak about “giving liberty to captives” (Luke 4:18), and we are always deeply touched by His compassion upon the crucified thief who asked Jesus to remember him as he entered into His Kingdom. Yet, we might ask ourselves how often our own outreach concerns extend to our incarcerated brothers and sisters and their families. Are we aware of the conditions in jails and prisons in our society?

America's rate of incarceration is great than any other nation's in the world: although our country has 5% of the world's population, it has 25% of its prisoners. Sentence length and time served are much longer in the US than elsewhere, and include more solitary confinement, less rehabilitations, and poor re-entry assistance. The levels of Covid-19 in many of our prisons promoted one NYC inmate to remark, “It's...like we aren't even human.” A crime data expert at the Brennan Center for Justice recently observed, “It is really a system that sets people up for failure.” (America, August 2020)

As we continue to struggle with our own confinements during the pandemic, let us deepen our understanding of the sufferings of our incarcerated sisters and brother and pray to know how we can best care for them. In the coming weeks of this Easter Season, our Diocesan Public Policy Committee will be providing further information and assistance to parishes in these efforts.
