CHOICES

Once upon a time there was a very arrogant, tyrannical king who ruled his subjects with an iron fist. One day he learned that his daughter had fallen in love with a poor commoner. Enraged that his daughter should even think of marrying a worthless peasant, the king determined to put an end to their relationship – permanently.

So the king had the young man charged with a serious crime. The commoner, of course, pled innocent. As was the custom, the fates would determine guilt or innocence. On the appointed day, the king summoned the people to the public square. The young man was brought before the king. The king held out two envelopes. Inside one envelope was a card with the word *INNOCENT*, the second contained a card with the word *GUILTY*. The commoner had to choose one - & that would determine whether he would be set free or executed.

Now the commoner was a very wise young man & he knew that the king wanted him executed no matter what. He knew the king had written *GUILTY* on both cards. So the commoner carefully chose one of the envelopes. He slowly opened it & silently read the card. Then he started jumping for joy shouting, "I'm innocent! I'm innocent!" as he jumped he ripped the card into small pieces & swallowed it.

One of the king's magistrates protested, "Wait! How do we know you are innocent? You destroyed the card before we could confirm it."

The young man said, "Sirs, all you have to do is read the remaining card that the king holds in his hand to see that I am innocent."

Like the king, we often try to manipulate the "truth" to our own ends; we seek to justify & rationalize our own sense of the "truth" to fit whatever our needs & wants. But it is in embracing the complete & real "truth" & paying the price to proclaim it that we can begin to transform our lives & our communities. A world that is more than willing to bend, shape, rework, edit, manipulate & rationalize the facts to fit a particular concept of "truth" does not appreciate nor welcome the Gospel's unvarnished proclamation of truth centered in the unconditional love of God & the sacredness of every human being who is created in the image & likeness of God. May the Easter Christ inspire us with the courage & vision to seek in all decisions & relationships the life-giving & affirming truth of the Father's love.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is an [FCC program](#) to help families and households struggling to afford internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. This new benefit will connect eligible households to jobs, critical healthcare services, virtual classrooms, and so much more.

About the Emergency Broadband Benefit
The Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

Who Is Eligible for the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program?
A household is eligible if a member of the household meets *one* of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 135% of the [Federal Poverty Guidelines](#) or participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, or [Lifeline](#);
- Approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision in the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 school year;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year;
- Experienced a substantial loss of income due to job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020 and the household had a total income in 2020 at or below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers; or

Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.

When Can I Sign Up for the Benefit?
As of May 12, 2021, eligible households will be able to enroll in the program to receive a monthly discount off the cost of broadband service from an approved provider. Eligible households can enroll through an approved provider or by visiting GetEmergencyBroadband.org.



These teams count and record the amounts of money and checks and then prepare the deposit slips for delivery to the bank.


