The art of piano-making with the Fazioli's

It's written in his contract: the great jazz pianist Herbie Hancock will only play a Fazioli piano at his concerts. For Hancock, the winner of 14 Grammys, no piano has the richness of sound that a piano made by Paolo and Luca Fazioli.

What makes a Fazioli piano so special?

The wood of red spruce trees from the Italian Dolomites.

The Faziolis trek 7,000 feet into the mountains to obtain the wood to make their pianos. The 200-year-old red spruce trees possess such exceptional acoustic qualities because the trees grow slowly in the harsh mountain winters, producing an even-grain plank that gives their instruments their wonderful sound. From the same Alpine forest centuries ago, master luthier Antonio Stradivari got the red spruce for his magnificent violins.

"The wood is very light," Paolo Fazioli explains, "and at the same time is also very strong."

Paolo founded the company 42 years ago. The son of furniture makers, Paolo rebuilt an old piano that sounded "terrible" and became fascinated with the inner workings of the instrument. Paolo Fazioli and his son Luca continue to run the company of fifty employees.

Fazioli is largely unknown outside elite music circles — and that's by design. The Faziolis turn out about 140 handcrafted pianos a year, each piano taking three years to build. Each instrument sells for upwards of \$200,000. Herbie Hancock discovered the Faziolis while on tour in Italy in 2003 and now will play no other piano.

Playing a Fazioli piano for the first time, Hancock remembers, "the sound was so sweet . . . It just begs you to play it."

The harsh winter storms of the Dolomite Mountains in Northern Italy "season" the wood that brings such magnificent music to life. We learn and grow and become stronger from the winters that storm through our lives that can leave us broken and lost — but in "waking" the Christ within us, in listening for the voice of Christ amid the roar, our "wood" becomes stronger and more vibrant; the "music" of our days becomes more resonant with meaning and grace. Within each of us is the grace of the "awakened" Jesus in today's Gospel: the wisdom, the patience, the courage to discern the presence of God amid the storms of tension, fear, anxiety, and injustice that batter our lives. The grace of the Risen Christ enables us to discern the presence of God amid the roar of anger and mistrust and to recognize the light of God in the darkness of selfishness and prejudice.

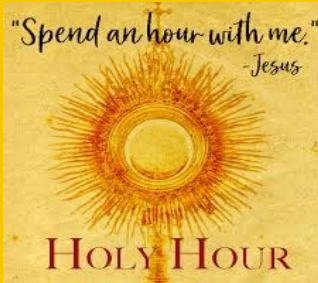

COMMUNION SERVICE LEADERS NEEDED

With the changes in the daily Mass schedule & our continual recovering from COVID, there will be a need for parishioners to lead Communion Services on the days that Mass is not celebrated.

Deacon Tim will do the services at St. Januarius on Mondays & Fridays. Deacon Roger will do the services on Tuesdays & Fridays at St. Michaels. So there is a need for someone to do the Wednesday service at St. Januarius & the Thursday Service at St. Michaels.

There should be perhaps 3 parishioners capable of doing the service at each worship site who would hopefully rotate on each of the open dates.

Leaders have to be Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion & should have gone through reader training. I have asked Deacons Tim & Roger to be responsible to train & update readers 7 Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist.

If you have preformed this ministry before I would ask you to sign up by putting your name into the open schedule spot located at St. Michaels on the sacristy bulletin board or at St. Januarius on the bulletin board outside the chapel.

If you are interested & not presently trained or would like more information on what is required please call the Parish Office & leave you name & contact information & you will be contacted when the deacons have finished their planning.



Offering Counter Teams Needed

The offering counters are volunteers who assist in providing **accurate, consistent, confidential** and timely processing of all donations and monetary gifts to the Church. Offering Counter Teams work in groups of three(3) unrelated people. (*i.e. Husband and Wife would be placed on separate teams*)

Usually the counting work is done immediately after the worship service though it may be set for a later time. Teams serve in a rotating schedule.

These teams count and record the amounts of money and checks and then prepare the deposit slips for delivery to the bank.
