Corpus Christi

The Church is celebrating this Sunday the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ. "The Feast of Corpus Christi is celebrated in the Catholic Church on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday or, in some places, it is transferred to the Sunday. The feast was instituted to honor the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament... On the 11 August 1264, Pope Urban IV published the Bull "*Transiturus de hoc mundo*", in which, after having extolled the love of Our Savior as expressed in the Holy Eucharist, he ordered the annual celebration of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, in the universal Church. The bull also granted many indulgences to the faithful for the attendance at Mass and at the Office. To celebrate the feast St Thomas Aquinas wrote the very beautiful liturgy celebrated on the Solemnity" (<https://www.mdrevelation.org/the-origins-of-the-feast-of-corpus-christi/>).

In this celebration, all Catholics celebrate the most beautiful gift that the Lord Jesus gave us: to be with us in the Eucharist. There should not be any doubt about the real presence of the Lord in the Eucharist. St. Paul reminds us why we celebrate the Eucharist. He wrote in his first letter to the Corinthians, "For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes" (1 Corinthians 11: 23-26).

Jesus is present in the Eucharist. We really receive His body and blood; hence, we said to the Lord, thank you because He is with us. We are united with Him in the Communion. Let us remember that the Eucharist is everything. It is the center of our faith because we have a personal encounter with the Lord Jesus in it. In the Eucharist we find the fullness of life, the eternal salvation, the mercy, grace, and happiness from God. The Eucharist is Jesus Christ present in our lives and let us remember that Jesus is God: the second person of the Holy Trinity. Therefore, the Eucharist is God. The Eucharist is an encounter with God made man.

This will be a drive-thru model; clients must stay in their car and put a piece of paper with first name and last name in window facing out for staff to see at check-in.



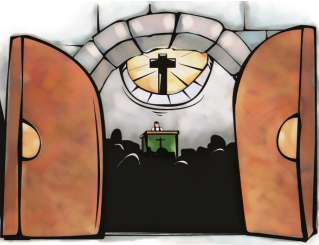

RCIA



Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a program instituted by the Church after the Second Vatican Council.

In the early Church it was adults who were attracted to Christians because of the way “they loved one another” & how they were willing to give witness (the meaning of the word “martyr”) to their faith. The saying goes, “The blood of the martyrs was the seed of the Church.”

The program is for people who have not been baptized; for people who were baptized in the name of the Trinity (Father, Son & Holy Spirit) who want to learn more about the Catholic faith & for those who were baptized Catholic but received no further religious education.

The offering counters are volunteers who assist in providing **accurate, consistent, confidential** and timely processing of all donations and monetary gifts to the Church.

Offering Counter Teams

work in groups of three(3) unrelated people. (*ie. Husband and Wife would be placed on separate teams*) Usually the counting work is done immediately after the worship service though it may be set for a later time. Teams serve in a rotating schedule.

These teams count and record the amounts of money and checks and then prepare the deposit slips for delivery to the bank.

It's for families with one or many "arrows in your quiver." It's a family formation because parents learn along with their child(ren). Each lesson gives parents the tools they need to break open the faith. Forms are available on our website, by email request or by stopping by the parish center. Then let them "catch" you practicing your road to holiness through private prayer, Bible reading and your practice of the Corporal & Spiritual Works of Mercy.

*Participation in Faith Formation is a lifelong process, but especially important for children preparing for Sacraments. A full year in the year prior and in the current year of preparation for Sacraments is required.
