### “THESE TIMES THEY ARE A CHANGING...”

It has been a couple of weekends since the change in the Mass schedule. I want to thank you for your understanding, support & encouragement during this time. This past month has felt like the aftermath of a storm! You look around, assess the damage, make plans to repair & rebuild. With the Covid pandemic coming “under control” & hopefully will stay under control, it is time to reflect on its effect on the parish. The committees & councils have not met during this past year & as the Pastoral Council (which met last Monday) is assessing the condition of the committees it is becoming evident that we need new members. I really need each & every parishioner to reflect on your talents & to come to the aid of your particular worship site. At the end of this article is one that Pope Francis addresses to older Catholics. In the future weeks I will be describing the responsibilities of each committee & council as outlined in our pastoral plan. Canon Law requires every parish to have a Finance COUNCIL; it strongly encourages every parish to have a Pastoral COUNCIL. Each COUNCIL is in desperate need for members, especially from St. Michael’s worship site.

VATICAN CITY Writing to his peers, Pope Francis told older Catholics that God is close to them and still has plans for their lives.

“I was called to become the Bishop of Rome when I had reached, so to speak, retirement age, and thought I would not be doing anything new,” said the Pope, who is 84 now and was elected when he was 76.

“The Lord is always — always — close to us. ... You know that the Lord is eternal; he never, ever goes into retirement,” the pope wrote in his message for the Catholic Church’s first celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.

The message was released at the Vatican June 22 in anticipation of the celebration July 25, the Sunday closest to the feast of Saints. Joachim and Anne, Jesus’ grandparents.

“Think about it: what is our vocation today, at our age? To preserve our roots, to pass on the faith to the young and to care for the little ones,” Francis wrote. “Never forget this.”

### WHAT CAN A DEACON DO?

With only one active priest in the parish, it’s important for parishioners to realize what a deacon can do. First, a deacon cannot celebrate Mass but when *serious need* arises a deacon can celebrate a Sunday liturgy in the absence of a priest. A deacon can do a funeral or a wedding service which excludes the parts of the Mass from the Preparation of the Gifts through the Great Amen. Holy Communion can be given during these services.

I am scheduled to go on vacation for 2 weeks (*from July 26<sup>th</sup> – August 6<sup>th</sup>*). The annual Diocesan Mission Appeal will take place on the weekend of July 31<sup>st</sup> & August 1<sup>st</sup>. Fr. Kevin Mannara, CSB (the Chaplain at St. John Fisher College) will be at all the Worship Sites that weekend to speak about the Basilian Fathers Missions.

While I am away, in the event that a family asks for a funeral service, Deacon Tim or Deacon Roger will conduct a funeral service. Again, the service includes all the preparations & prayers of a regular funeral service except the Eucharistic prayer but Holy Communion can still be distributed.

The other option is for the burial to take place & a Memorial Mass can take place when I return.

In the future a Deacon will be conducting a funeral service if a family requests a funeral on a Friday.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)** is a program instituted by the Church after the Second Vatican Council.

In the early Church it was adults who were attracted to Christians because of the way “they loved one another” & how they were willing to give witness (the meaning of the word “martyr”) to their faith. The saying goes, “The blood of the martyrs was the seed of the Church.”

The program is for people who have not been baptized; for people who were baptized in the name of the Trinity (Father, Son & Holy Spirit) who want to learn more about the Catholic faith & for those who were baptized Catholic but received no further religious education.
