Fr. Jerry Orbos, SVD, in his homily, also asked: “*De lata ba ang puso mo?* (Do you have a canned heart?). A canned heart is a closed heart where no one goes in and no love goes out. It doesn’t get heart. It is a well-preserved heart with lots of preservatives! Inside a canned heart, there are no disturbances, no crises, no life and no love. How do you know if you have a canned heart? You shut out God from your heart. You hold back your heart-your love from others. You are filled with hatred, guilt, hurts, pride and other filth. What you need is a can opener – *abre lata* – to open your heart. God is the *abre lata* of all hearts. Allow Him to open your heart.

How does this apply to us? This gospel reading says to us that we must not identify our religion or be religious with just performing external acts like: going to church on Sundays and attending Mass, saying prayers, reading the Bible or giving to charity because these do not guarantee us holiness. What is the most important is the love in our hearts that motivates us to do what we do. We go to Mass and we pray to God because we love Him so much. We give charity to those in need because we love them. If our hearts are filled with bitterness and pride, then all these external acts won’t make us holy before God and enter His Kingdom.

Jesus Christ is reminding us when he stresses that our heart and not our stomach, needs watching for if we follow the inclinations of our heart, we will be defiled at times. Jesus is not concerned about the content of our stomach. What matters is the content of our heart. A lot of unclean things may enter us and not soil us because the heart does not accept them. As one priest said: “We may have seen something very obscene; we may have been exposed to a lot of corruption; we may have heard a lot of gossip; we may have been the object of hatred. These occasions may disturb us and arouse strong feelings or temptations in us. As long as we do not accept them or consent to them in our heart, they have no power over us, they do not defile us.”

At the end allow me to tell this anecdote in order for us to reflect more. There were two monks who were of the monastery on an errand. On their way back, they saw a beautiful woman by the riverbank. She asked if they could help her cross the river so her clothes would not get wet. The first monk vehemently refused. He said that he had a vow of chastity and had not touched a woman. The second monk told her to get on his back and without saying anything carried her across the river. The two return to the monastery in silence. But after some time, the second monk was summoned by the abbot and asked to explain the ‘indecent’ incident. The monk replied that he indeed carried the beautiful woman on his back and then forgot all about it. The abbot there then understood that the first monk who had not forgotten and even reported the incident to him was the one who had a problem of chastity.

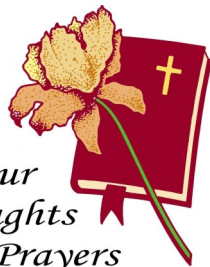
A JOURNEY IN FAITH

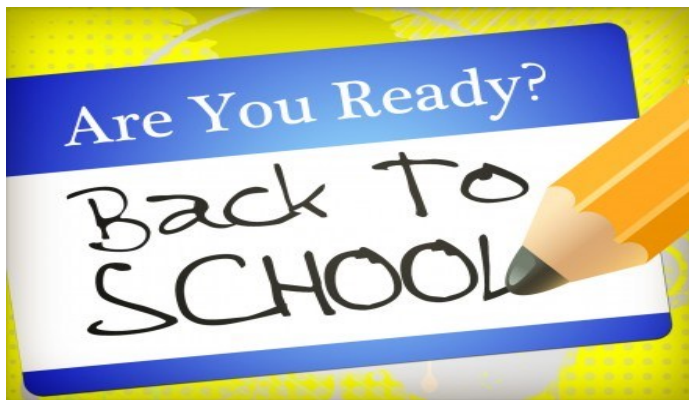

Excerpt from letter to families at St. Michael's School:
We have been working hard to prepare for students to return for the 2021-2022 school year. Although the start of the school year is not what we hoped for when we left in June, we are confident that we will continue to keep the students, families, and staff safe and healthy this upcoming year. Due to the diligence and dedication from all members of the school community, we had a very safe and successful year last year. I have every confidence that using the information we gathered throughout the year and the dedication everyone has to the school community, we will be even more successful this year. After reviewing the guidance provided by the New York State Department of Education, the CDC, and the Yates County Department of Health, our school plan for reopening has been completed. This plan is unique to the environment that St. Michael School can provide and therefore may be different than the other Yates County public schools due to their constraints. Our goal with this reopening is to safely have all students back at school in the most productive and safe setting possible.
After seeing the success we had last year in keeping all classrooms open, we will be returning to the procedures that we were following in June. We will continue to use the PUP App for student health checks and obtaining morning temperature checks before the students enter the school. This will help us monitor for any potential concerns before a student enters the building. We will also continue to use the drop-off and pick-up procedures from last year. We will share those procedures in more detail before the start of school. Demonstrating diligence and responsibility in monitoring symptoms is a key first layer of protection to ensuring our school can stay open for in-person learning. All families must monitor their children for symptoms daily and keep students home if they are exhibiting any of the recognized symptoms, returning to school once symptom-free or cleared by a physician. Our shared commitment for early symptom identification will help keep our entire school community healthy. Symptoms may include fever, chills, shortness of breath, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, headache, cough, nasal congestion, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, muscle, or body aches. Specific protocols are forthcoming from the Yates County Department of Health.
We appreciate everyone's hard work in keeping our children and community safe and healthy and I believe that we can once again provide a healthy and happy environment for the whole school community.



MISSALETTES BECOMING HYMNALS

Beginning with the new Liturgical Year (November 28th, the First Sunday of Advent) all worship sites will be transitioning to a hardbound hymnal that contains the weekend readings for all 3 cycles of the Liturgical Year.

This will save us from having to change the missalettes each year. Cost-wise there is more of an initial expense but after 3 years they will have paid for themselves.

When I did this transition in another parish, parishioners had an opportunity to donate the cost of a hymnal & a name plate was placed in the front of the hymnal. The donation requested is \$20 per hymnal. If you are interested, please fill out the form below, place it in an envelope & drop it into the collection container.

When the hymnals are placed at the worship sites, they are the property of the parish & **ARE NOT TO BE TAKEN FROM THE WORSHIP SITE.** With the Missalettes sometimes people "borrowed" one for themselves or for a homebound parishioner.
