KNOW-LOVE-SERVE

On this Respect Life Sunday, we read about God knowing Himself and us, His creation, well enough to know that we need each other.

It didn't suit God to have created everything and not have someone like Himself with whom to have relationship. He knew Adam well enough to know that he needed a "suitable" helpmate, Eve. God knew love isn't true love if the beloved doesn't have free-will, despite God giving directions on how to live well and stay safe.

Knowing ourselves, we ask for God's continuous blessing, throughout the phases of life.

St. Paul explained God's love for us through Christ Jesus in our second reading, telling us that "for a little while" Jesus was made "lower than the angels." God wants us to know that He knows all our trials, joys, temptations and weaknesses because Jesus, truly God and truly man, experienced all of that, yet remained sinless. He took all our sins to the Cross so that He could lead us to Heaven. **Jesus laid down His life for us – the sinless for the sinful. If that isn't true love, what is?**

"If we love one another, God remains in us and His love is brought to perfection in us." (1 John 4:12) So, will we? Will we love & serve each other by doing our best? By saying yes when asked to learn more about God? Or do something that will help the Parish? The needy? The world? Remember, our first citizenship is in Heaven. The land of our birth is secondary.

Matrimony is a Sacrament of Service (as is Holy Orders). The husband is to attend to the needs of his wife, and she to him. As children come, the product of the celebration of self-sacrificing love, the couple then serves the needs of their children. *Selfishness has no place in marriage or family life! Nor the life of a Christian.* And yet, it happens...

Rejoice, dear family! We have a way back to repaired relationships through the Sacrament of Reconciliation – a Sacrament of Healing. This is a must when one has committed mortal sin ("...in my thoughts, in my words, in what I have done or failed to do") that violates the great commandment -- to love God above all else, and to love your neighbor as yourself. Sacramental reconciliation offers advantage in the case of venial sin, too, because we are strengthened by God's Holy Spirit (with the intercession of the heavenly hosts) to be more Christ-like. When we try to live as Christ did, we are helping to share the Good News and helping to live a culture of life.

Our Gospel reading ends with Jesus saying we must have the faith of a child to accept His teachings and enter the Kingdom. Let's not make it hard on ourselves! Have child-like faith. The world tries to pull us apart, but our Savior wants us to be in His arms. Keep that in mind when you look upon the Crucifix.

I handed out background material in what Stewardship was all about & the group over the following months read the material & developed a plan for the parish.

We divided the year into 3 parts with one aspect of Stewardship being emphasized in each. With Advent being the beginning of the Church's liturgical year, Stewardship of Time was stressed. Parishioners were invited to submit how much time they were willing to give to develop their own spiritual life, i.e. how much time would they give back to God in prayer.

Unfortunately, the committee has lost several members & in order to implement the various aspects of Stewardship in the future, I need your support.

Forms for the Stewardship of Time (personnel spiritual commitment) need to be formatted.

Coordination with the committees & organizations in the parish are needed for the Stewardship of Talent.
