This weekend we “celebrate” the unofficial end of summer –Labor Day. Labor Day dates back to 1882, when 13 men were killed and 57 were wounded by participating in a strike against the Pullman Palace Car Company, during one of our country’s depressions. The company cut wages to workers already suffering economically. The strike fueled unionized work opportunities. Today, the holiday pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of everyday working families, giving them one additional day of rest on the first Monday of September.

This holiday affirms the Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers, one of the seven principles of Catholic Social Teaching. The principle states that there is inherent dignity in work and that work exists for people, not the opposite. Also this weekend, our readings refer to the Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope & Love.

Theology is the study of God. Some may say, “It’s been a long time since I was in Religious Ed.” Perhaps true. However, in the Catechism it says we are made by God for God. God desires and delights in a relationship with us. Are we giving God the chance to have that relationship? It can be developed through prayer, study and action. It takes a willing heart, a desire to change and grow and the support of each other, the community of believers.

Our parish has made an investment in our opportunity to learn more about God and His bride, The Church, and to grow as a parish by purchasing a 1 year subscription to “FORMED, The Catholic Faith On Demand.” Access it for free on your computer, tablet, smart phone (Apple & Android) or on Roku TV. To sign in for the many videos, podcasts, Bible studies and more go to <http://signup.formed.org/>. Enter our parish zip code (14527). Enter your name and email. You are in!

There is a series of videos called “The Search.” It asks the pivotal questions: “What do you seek?” “Who Are You?” “Why a God?” “What’s Our Story?” “Who Is Jesus?” “Am I Saved?” and “Why A Church?” Begin with them on your own. Share the sign-in opportunity with others (non-Catholics, too). A calendar is still in development that will offer discussion opportunities for “The Search” and other programs offered through Formed. Look for notices these through our usual communication channels (bulletin announcements, Facebook posts, emails), or call requesting information.

When we learn more about God, we learn of his great love and mercy. We develop that relationship God desires for each of us through learning, prayer and service. Like at Mass, these actions changes us, forming us into Jesus’ disciples – so needed in today’s world. God bless us all!

Sept. 5 – Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mk 7:31-37: People brought to Jesus a man who could not hear and did not speak well. Jesus looked up to heaven and said, “Ephphatha!” which means, “Be opened!” And the man was healed!

Name some things God has done that make you say, “Wow!”

Do you search for a reliable source of Catholic teaching on current issues? Tune in each week to *The Augustine Institute Show with Dr. Tim Gray*.

Have you despaired of finding good movies that your family can enjoy together on a Friday night? Start with *Mother Teresa*, the story of the selfless saint who brought hope and love to the poorest of the poor.

You can enjoy FORMED on your computer or on your television with an inexpensive Roku device or Apple TV. You can even listen on your phone as you commute to work or do chores.

When I did this transition in another parish, parishioners had an opportunity to donate the cost of a hymnal & a name plate was placed in the front of the hymnal.
