### You just don't get it, Jesus . . .

"So what must I do to inherit eternal life?" the rich young man asks Jesus. Jesus' reply: "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor."

"And the young man walked away sad," Mark writes, "for he had many possessions." No doubt.

"I knew it," he muttered as he walked away, "another bleeding-heart, sunshine-and-lollipops do-gooder. *Sell what you have and give to the poor.* Sure. Easy for him. He has nothing. Easy to suggest giving away other people's money. It's always the same spiel."

Even if I did — like it's really going to make a difference? If I sell everything, I might make a few people less poor for a while, but what really changes? Nothing.

Treasure in the next life is one thing — but what about *this* life, now? Jesus, you don't have a business, a mortgage or students loans to pay off. How can I just walk away from those responsibilities?

Being poor is better than rich? Trust me. It's not.

Who pays the taxes that supports programs for the poor? Who pays workers so they can feed their families? Who supports the temple and the schools and academies?

*Sell what you have and give to the poor?*

Sorry I asked, Jesus.

Just another one of those traveling religious medicine shows. He talks a great line — but that's not the way life is.

Jesus, you just don't get it.

**Or is it the rich young man who doesn't get it? Listen carefully to what Jesus says in today's Gospel: Jesus doesn't condemn wealth and possessions as evil in themselves — what is evil is when the pursuit of wealth and riches displaces God as the center of our lives, when material wealth becomes the focus of our existence, when what we own owns us. Given the choice between the life of God and the life of materialism, the young man opts for the latter. May we possess the faith to center our lives on the things of God, to embrace the "wisdom and prudence" (Reading 1) to realize that the things we have are not an end in themselves but the means for living lives of meaning and purpose and re-creating our world in the justice and peace of God.**

But the young man finds this teaching a hard pill to swallow since, like many others, he believed his wealth was a sure sign of God's blessing. Even today the "prosperity gospel" is widespread: the belief that wealth is a sign of God's approval, and poverty and hardship a sign of God's disapproval. Therefore, when Jesus said how hard it would be for rich people to enter the kingdom of God, his disciples were astonished and asked, "Then who can be saved?" (v. 26). The real gospel challenges the prosperity gospel, for God's love can go hand in hand with material poverty. In fact, voluntary, dedicated poverty can be a way of responding to God's love. Materialism is the belief that without wealth life is meaningless. The rich young man was a materialist at heart. We can pray today to have more wisdom avoiding materialism in all its forms. For what is the use of gaining the whole world and losing our life in the process?

*Managing God's Gifts To Us*

Several years ago the Stewardship Committee was started at Our Lady of the Lakes. I remember the initial meeting where about 16 people were crowded into the dining room at the parish center. I handed out background material in what Stewardship was all about & the group over the following months read the material & developed a plan for the parish.

We divided the year into 3 parts with one aspect of Stewardship being emphasized in each. With Advent being the beginning of the Church's liturgical year, Stewardship of Time was stressed. Parishioners were invited to submit how much time they were willing to give to develop their own spiritual life, i.e. how much time would they give back to God in prayer.

Unfortunately, the committee has lost several members & in order to implement the various aspects of Stewardship in the future, I need your support.

Forms for the Stewardship of Time (personnel spiritual commitment) need to be formatted.

Coordination with the committees & organizations in the parish are needed for the Stewardship of Talent.
