See ya again in 2024!

Today is the last Sunday that we will read from the Gospel of Mark until 2024. Next Sunday, is the Feast of Christ the King, and the Gospel reading comes from John. Therefore, it seems fitting to take a brief moment and reflect on Mark's Gospel. It is easy to overlook, or be somewhat dismissive, of Mark's Gospel. Mark is very short and at times can come across as rushed and terse. Mark's prose seems to lack the eloquence that we find in the other Gospels. Further, we don't seem to find the theological sophistication that one would suspect to find in a Gospel. I very much doubt that anyone would turn to Mark if they decided to sit down and start reading from the Bible.

However, underneath Mark's seeming simplicity, lies a Gospel with tremendous insight. To use a cliché, the Gospel of Mark is a "diamond in the rough." For example, consider the beginning and the end of Mark. Mark tells us something quite profound. After Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan, scripture tells us that,

"... immediately coming up out of the water, He saw the heavens opening, and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon Him." - Mk 1:10 NAS.

This common translation misses an important point. The word translated as "open" comes from the Greek word *schizo*, which means to rip or to tear. We get our word schizophrenia from this Greek word. In other words, the heavens were not simply opened, they were "torn apart." Consider this same verse from the ESV,

"... immediately he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove." - Mk 1:10 ESV

Mark is showing us just how dramatically the Spirit enters the world. However, Mark doesn't stop here. Near the end of the Gospel, after Jesus has been crucified, we read that

"And Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom." Mk 15:37-38 ESV

Here, we have the same Greek word *schizo*. "Simplistic" Mark is connecting the beginning of his Gospel with the end of his Gospel. Further, Mark is letting his readers know that the barrier between God and us has been torn apart in the same way in which the Spirit entered into the world and rested on Jesus after his baptism. This connection is pretty impressive for such a short and seemingly "simplistic" Gospel.

Today, if you have the time, try reading Mark's Gospel in one sitting. It takes about an hour to read. I think that if you read it in one sitting, you might find the Gospel far more enjoyable, sophisticated, and insightful than might first meet the eye.

Managing God's Gifts To Us

Several years ago the Stewardship Committee was started at Our Lady of the Lakes. I remember the initial meeting where about 16 people were crowded into the dining room at the parish center. I handed out background material in what Stewardship was all about & the group over the following months read the material & developed a plan for the parish.

We divided the year into 3 parts with one aspect of Stewardship being emphasized in each. With Advent being the beginning of the Church's liturgical year, Stewardship of Time was stressed. Parishioners were invited to submit how much time they were willing to give to develop their own spiritual life, i.e. how much time would they give back to God in prayer.

Unfortunately, the committee has lost several members & in order to implement the various aspects of Stewardship in the future, I need your support.

- *Forms for the Stewardship of Time (personnel spiritual commitment) need to be formatted.
- *Coordination with the committees & organizations in the parish are needed for the Stewardship of Talent.
