### “LEST WE FORGET”

This weekend marks our annual Remembrance weekend where we remember the parishioners, family & friends who have died during this past year. This year especially has been difficult & challenging because of Covid. Funerals & memorial services had to be postponed, delayed because families were unable to gather because of travel restrictions due to Covid.

November lends itself to thinking & reflection about what life is all about. The Church's liturgical season is coming to a close. Our readings speak about the end time; judgment & being prepared because we know not the day or the hour that we will die. The fall season with the leaves changing, the weather getting colder, the garden yielding its last fruits & the amount of daylight diminishing all lend to this feeling of dying.

Turning 70 years old at the end of October, reminded me that my grandmother's wake was during my birthday. I am also reminded that all my grandparents died before they were 70. With someone in my family dying every year at one point in my young life, I thought that someone in my family had to die every year.

Thinking a little about our mortality puts the world in perspective. It helps us see what matters, & also the foolishness of things that finally do not matter.

Socrates said that his philosophizing was best understood as a preparation for dying. It sounds like an odd claim, but it makes perfect sense. He had a passion for truth-telling; for the wisdom that comes from it; & for the life of integrity that results. The very word “philosophy” captures his love for truth. It ties *philia*, the Greek word for friendship-love, to *Sophia*, which means wisdom. Socrates didn't “study” wisdom. He pursued it as the framework of his life. He *loved* it as a friend.

Love is demanding. It draws us outside ourselves. The more we love, the greater our willingness to sacrifice. When we know, honestly, what we're willing to sacrifice for, even to die for, we can see the true nature of our loves. That tells us who we really are.

In John's Gospel, Martha & Mary are upset with Jesus when He did not come right away when they sent word that Lazarus was sick. When Jesus finally came they said if He had been there Lazarus would not have died. Jesus challenge them in their grief & stated that He is the Resurrection & the Life, whoever believes in Him though they died will have eternal life. Do you believe this? In times of grief we too are asked the same question, do we have the faith, the trust to reply, “I do.”?

Eternal rest grant to them O Lord... Let perpetual light shine upon them... May they rest in peace... May their souls & the souls of all the faithfully departed rest in peace. Amen.

Managing God's Gifts To Us

Several years ago the Stewardship Committee was started at Our Lady of the Lakes. I remember the initial meeting where about 16 people were crowded into the dining room at the parish center. I handed out background material in what Stewardship was all about & the group over the following months read the material & developed a plan for the parish.

We divided the year into 3 parts with one aspect of Stewardship being emphasized in each. With Advent being the beginning of the Church’s liturgical year, Stewardship of Time was stressed. Parishioners were invited to submit how much time they were willing to give to develop their own spiritual life, i.e. how much time would they give back to God in prayer.

Unfortunately, the committee has lost several members & in order to implement the various aspects of Stewardship in the future, I need your support.

\*Forms for the Stewardship of Time (personnel spiritual commitment) need to be formatted.

\*Coordination with the committees & organizations in the parish are needed for the Stewardship of Talent.

\*Parishioners are needed to obtain & put together the various reports from the committees & organizations for the annual report.
